Sue Wallick, Assoc. Love Gift/Special Project

Our 2017-2018 special project is Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, OK (<u>http://</u> <u>www.murrowindianchildrenshome.o</u> rg).

Since 1902, when two Indian tribes donated land for an orphanage, Murrow Indian Children's Home has provided loving care for hundreds of Native American children. Ministries include residential care, and day care for children of teen mothers who are in high school and attend parenting classes.

A gift of \$15,732 will allow for Murrow to purchase four new 25.2 cu. ft. refrigerators for the cottages. The current refrigerators are old with loose seals. Each new refrigerator casts &999.90. IN addition, funds would be used to replace and relocate three of the six hot water heaters. The cast of each hot water heater is \$440.90 and the cost to relocate them is &1,815.25 each. Three of the hot water heaters are over 30 years old and relocating them would allow for more efficient use of space The remaining funds would be used to purchase a commercial freezer at \$5,000 to store commodities and donated meat until it is sent to the cottages.

Please keep Murrow and the children they serve in your prayers, and prayerfully give what you can to help raise support for a worthy and much-needed ministry.
